Letter from the Vicarage

Dear friends

The nature of publishing deadlines are such that I find myself sitting at my desk in the second week of November trying to project forward in order to write a letter which will cover Advent, Christmas and the Epiphany! And yet world events seem to dominate my thoughts at the moment: the war in Northern Iraq and Syria; the millions on the move fleeing conflict; the threat of terrorism in the air on holiday planes; the drought worsening in the Horn of Africa; migrants risking all to get to Europe, and so it goes on. So much fear, pain and sadness is hard to comprehend. Against such horror my own sadness in writing this my last Christmas letter for the magazine is trivial - it pales into insignificance - and yet in itself it heralds a time of change, a time of uncertainty.

Change here at Hey may seem to be alarming but it opens up huge fresh and exciting opportunities. Just one of those opportunities is that after many years in this format the Parish Magazine will be changing its style and shape as it tries to reach out and engage with a wider distribution, both in a hard copy version for those who currently receive them but also a version that can be read on line. I would like to publicly thank David Green for the huge amount of time and effort that has gone in over the years in producing a highly professional monthly magazine. So this edition is a bit of a bumper finale. David has written elsewhere in this magazine about the plans for future publications. Change will increasingly embrace how things are managed at Hey as I hand over areas of responsibility or different ways of doing things emerge. I do encourage you to strip out the negative tones of change and uncertainty and focus of the positives of excitement, the endless possibilities, not having to do it "Richard's way" any longer (that will be a relief for some I know!) a sense of liberation and freedom and the fun of building something new and vibrant on the foundations you have at Hey.

So let me return to the focus of this letter - Advent.

Advent is the season when the main emphasis is upon HOPE. It is a time when we look forward with growing excitement to our celebration of the coming of Christ at Christmas when we shall rejoice at the hope He brings. We begin to be caught up as the children at school start to prepare for the nativity plays, the shops and streets become more decorative and we are subjected to even more pressure selling of the material things that we could well do without. But within all the commercialisation we must not lose sight of the truth that at Christmas we come face to face with the Creator God who is born into the pain, sadness and death of our world. A world He loves so much that He gives it total freedom, freedom to be inventive, creative and yet a freedom that allows it to be the agents of it's own destruction. A love so great that we have the freedom to nail Him day after day on a cross. So at Christmas we welcome into the world the King of peace who suffers at our hands. Now that is a God I can believe in, a God

who knows what suffering is all about. He is not standing aloof but is engaged with the pain of our world, the pain of the refugee and migrant, lying alongside those sleeping rough on our street even sharing with your pain and my pain.

As we hold onto the hope that Christ brings in His birth let us also remember that we, as Christians, have enormous responsibilities too as Christ calls each and every one of us to share in the job of building His Kingdom of love, forgiveness, peace and justice for all.

In the Peace and Love of Christ I wish you all

a very Happy Christmas and an exciting 2016

CHARITABLE GIVING

We take seriously our responsibility as a Christian community to reach out and help those who are disadvantaged or in times of need through our charitable giving. A community that only looks inward dies so each month we put aside an amount of money in order that towards the end of the year (or during the year if there is a Crisis appeal) we are able to give to a number of international, national and local charities. If you would like to make a suggestion of a particular charity to be supported let us know the name and charity number and we'll add it to the list for consideration.

Charitable Giving for 2015

Thank you for your generosity towards our Charitable efforts this year. As a church we tithe a percentage of what we spend on ourselves to Charity – a good biblical imperative. We are committed to pay our parish share to the Diocese which this year is £43,376. On top of that we allocated £2,400 this year to charitable giving which is about 8% of what we spend on ourselves. Over the year we put aside an amount of money each month so that in November the PCC can distribute that money to worthy causes. The PCC decided that this year we will support these charities by sending £300 to each of the following:

DEC – Disaster Emergency Committee – Nepal earthquake sent in April.

Save the Children - Refugee fund - sent in September

Cancer Research UK - helping fund research particularly work in Manchester hospitals.

Myotubular Trust - research and support for children & families with this condition **WaterAid UK** - bringing clean water and proper sanitation to many parts of the Third world

The Booth Centre - helping the homeless in Greater Manchester

Cold Nights - local charity providing clothing and warmth for local rough sleepers

Dr Kershaw's - our local hospice

Additionally we support:

Christian Aid Week in the spring collection raised £325.

Harvest - In October we had two foci:

Oldham Foodbank a collection of food

British Red Cross money collection of £ 250 European Refugee Crisis Appeal

Children's Society and Francis House - Sunday School continues to raise money for Francis House and we will split the Christingle and Nativity Service collection between them as in previous years.

Samaritan's Purse - We are supporting them by filling shoe boxes to be sent to the most disadvantaged children in the world.

Concern for the world beyond our own doors is one sign of a healthy Christian Community






