Dear friends,

What a glorious time it is, the disciples must have been overwhelmed. Everything written in the law of Moses, the Prophets

and the Psalms concerning Jesus has come true, there he was standing in front of them just days after dying on the cross, and a now a promise of a Holy gift, the Holy Spirit who would help them, they must have been ecstatic!

Holy Scripture tells us they stayed continuously at the temple praising God. I bet they did, I bet they ran all the way there. Towards matters of social justice, we should be a loud and clear voice to be a living witness to Christ in this world and in our lives. And if we get it right, if we hear that Holy helper clearly and free from the sinful baggage that usually gets in the way, I imagine they'll be much more to do besides all of these things.

Jesus says we have been clothed with power from on high; the time to don those clothes and be the people God is calling us to be is here, the mission to proclaim the good news is for today. There is no tomorrow in the mission of Christ, only now.

And so I invite you, as I prepare to depart with my family, to live in the joy of this season proclaimed by Jesus to his disciples, but live also in the knowledge there is work to do. Let us therefore prepare ourselves through prayer and worship, continuously, as the disciples did and give of ourselves completely and utterly in the service of God.
